## What do Bed Bugs Look Like?

Bed bugs are hard to identify. Look for their different stages of life:










Check your furniture for rusty stains, dark spots, and egg cases:



A bite from a bed bug can cause a red rash in some people:








## Preventing Bed Bugs

You can pick up bed bugs from anywhere-furniture, bedding, luggage, boxes, and clothing! Follow these routine steps to avoid bed bugs:



Check furniture for signs of infestation.



Clean bed sheets.

Use a zip cover encasement on mattresses and box springs.





using chemical pesticides: Find and remove as many bugs as possible. Use clear packing tape or extra


sticky lint rollers to remove bugs and eggs from surfaces.

If the above steps do not work and pesticides are needed...

Use pesticides safely.

Look for EPA-registered pesticides.

If you use a licensed exterminator, ask them about options that do not involve pesticides, such as steaming or freezing.


